Tongariro National Park Fires

The devastation of nearly 3,000 hectares of the National Park is currently disrupting access to the Tongariro Alpine Crossing and the Maungatopopo track. The RMCA attended the hui held this week. Attendees included Iwi, DoC, Ski Field operators, FENZ, Tourism operators and Civil Defence.

DoC is making good progress on the assessment of the damage. The fire has reduced parts of the park to ash, destroyed some infrastructure, and poses a long-term threat of invasive weeds (gorse and broom) and wilding pines re-establishing themselves. The RMCA has expressed a keen desire to work with DoC on the restoration and recovery of the TNP over the period of the 10 year restorative rahui.

DoC wishes to thank the clubs that offered accommodation to displaced residents and volunteer fire fighters from outside of the region. These clubs offered accommodation in Ohakune with no expectation of remuneration. Thank you, **Ruapehu Ski Club, Aorangi Ski Club, Tongariro Ski Club** and **Havelock Ski Club** for demonstrating aroha to ensure volunteers had a place to sleep.

Collaboration with DoC and Iwi remains a key pillar for the RMCA and member clubs in the next 10 years.
